A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF MCCOOK, SOUTH DAKOTA ESTABLISHING POLICIES AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SALE OR TRANSFER OF WASTE PRODUCTS, RECYCLABLE MATERIALS, OR SCRAP FROM HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT USE.

WHEREAS, the County of McCook Highway Department regularly collects waste products, recyclable materials, and scrap materials; (hereinafter "such materials") and

WHEREAS, at times such materials have value, although often only slight value; and

WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the County of McCook to sell or transfer such materials without the formality required of SDCL Chapter 6-13, for the disposal of surplus property; and

WHEREAS, SDCL 34A-6-63.1 allows such disposal.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Highway Superintendent shall be authorized to sell or transfer all such excess materials to any interested party. The

County Commission may attempt to identify additional prospective buyers and may negotiate the conditions of such transactions with prospective buyers, including price, delivery, transport, quantity, and length of contract, to obtain the price or conditions most advantageous to the governing body, all as allowed by SDCL 34A-6-63.1. No County Commission member or other officer of the county may purchase or acquire the materials described in this resolution unless such materials are available for sale to or acquisition by the general public.

Second Butzke and motion carried. Motion made by Smith to hold a County Surplus Property Auction on Saturday, May 3, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. Second Scharffenberg and motion carried. Kreutzfeldt reported that the disc mower has been repaired, approximately \$3000.00. The benefits vs. high maintenance costs of disc mowers for highway use were discussed. Kreutzfeldt presented the 2014 SD Bridge Summary Report to the Board. McCook County has 72 structures with 17 functionally obsolete or structurally deficient. At this time, the SDDOT is not accepting new resolutions for Federal-aid bridges; available federal funds are already committed beyond the year 2025.

No drainage permits.

Motion was made by Smith to enter into Executive Session at 10:30 a.m. to discuss pending litigation. Second made by Dybdahl and motion carried. States Attorney, Mike Fink, and Carol Lauer, Treasurer, were present. Chairman Dick declared out of Executive Session at 11:05 a.m.

Auditor Sherman, Mariann Oyen, Benefits Specialist, Mike Fink, States Attorney, and the Commissioners reviewed and discussed Care of Poor cases. Three (3) Notices of Hospitalization were received from Avera McKennan Hospital (2014-19, 2014-21, and 2014-22). A Notice of Hospitalization was received from Avera Queen of Peace Hospital (2014-20). Two (2) Hospital Requests for Payment from Avera Queen of Peace were denied; individuals haven't applied for county assistance, therefore eligibility cannot be determined (2013-39 and 2013-34). Two (2) Hospital Requests for Payment from Sanford Medical Center were denied; individuals haven't applied for county assistance, therefore eligibility cannot be determined (2014-14 and 2014-13). Repayment Contracts have been sent to individuals receiving county assistance and if they refuse to work with Auditor's Office, they will be turned over to Noll Collection. An Application for County Assistance for hospital claim was approved (2014-07). Lien payments received the month of March were presented to the Commissioners.

Sandy Abney met with the Commissioners to inquire about county aid liens against property that she purchased, filed against Bruce Flack \$200.00 in 1989 & Marsha Flack \$\$2047.12 in 1997. Mike Fink, States Attorney, was present. Ms. Abney asked the Board if they would consider an offer of payment to get the liens cleared up, allowing her to continue with sale of the property. Yes.
