The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Ralph Dybdahl. Members present: Marc Dick, Ron Scharffenberg, Steve Gordon, and Sheldon Butzke.

Chairman Dybdahl led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Dybdahl called for approval of the Agenda. Auditor Sherman noted 1:00 p.m. deletion, Jason Brown, and Kreutzfeldt asked if drainage permits could be moved to 9:10 a.m. because an individual is here for one of the permits. Motion made by Scharffenberg to approve the Agenda with changes noted. Second Gordon and motion carried.

The minutes from the July 28th meeting were sent to Board members for review prior to publication. Chairman Dybdahl called for approval of same. Motion made by Butzke to approve these minutes for publication. Second Scharffenberg and motion carried.

Motion made by Butzke to convene as Drainage Commission. Second made by Gordon and motion carried.

Drainage Administrator Kreutzfeldt presented two drainage permit applications, noting that downstream landowner signatures were obtained for one and he has signed off on it, but the other needs board approval:

place. Dennis Dick was present. Motion made by Comm Dick to approve permit and authorize Chairman Dybdahl to sign same. Second Scharffenberg and motion carried.

Grant Twp will be restoring the ditch on 445th Ave between 262nd St & 263rd St to previous condition resolving the unauthorized drainage issue.

resident. An Application for County Assistance for a hospital bill was denied because the

application is incomplete (2015-14). One Notice of Hospitalization was received from Prairie Lake Healthcare System (2015-44). An Avera McKennan Hospital Request for Payment was denied because the individual hasn't applied for assistance, therefore eligibility cannot be determined (2015-28). A Hospital Request for Payment was returned to Avera McKennan Hospital because the individual is a Hutchinson County resident. Four Hospital Requests for Payment received from Avera Queen of Peace Health Services were denied because none of the individuals have applied for assistance (2014-71, 2014-72, 2014-68 and 2015-03).
