The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Bill Smith. Members present: Ralph Dybdahl, Sheldon Butzke, Marc Dick, Ron Scharffenberg.

Chairman Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Smith called for approval of the Agenda. Motion made by Dybdahl to approve the Agenda. Second made by Butzke and motion carried.

Auditor Sherman noted several corrections to the November 12<sup>th</sup> minutes: bid letting for truck chassis to be held at 10:30 a.m. on January 14, 2014, not 10:45 and under EDS Fund, Triotel and Verizon were noted twice, second listing correct. Motion made by Dick to approve corrections. Second made by Butzke and motion carried.

The minutes from the November 26<sup>th</sup> meeting were sent to Board members for review prior to publication. Chairman Smith called for approval of same. Motion made by Dick to approve these minutes for publication. Second Butzke and motion carried.

Commissioner Reports: Smith: JDC meeting rescheduled.

Mic Kreutzfeldt, Hwy Supt, presented quotes for 50/50 blend diesel fuel: Cole's Petroleum \$3.2178/gallon; Central Farmers Cooperative no bid; and Stern Oil no bid. Motion made by Scharffenberg to accept the quote from Cole's Petroleum. Second made by Dybdahl and motion carried. Kreutzfeldt reported that he spoke with Tracy Hofer, Dir of Equalization, about landowner changes in the Beacon website not being up to date. Hofer informed him that the changes are made immediately when received by Schneider Corp, but due to software upgrades in Equalization office there has been a 2 to 3 month lag in 2013. This issue should be resolved soon. 2014 chip sealing and re-graveling projects were reviewed. Kreutzfeldt noted that the County will be storing a truck plow in the Canistota Fire Dept building over winter months to service the area more quickly. Kreutzfeldt stated that he is working with Montrose City to reach a salt/sand agreement similar to what is being done in Canistota. McCook County's current Statewide Transportation Program (STP) fund balance is \$216,037.43. These dollars can only be used on eligible Federal Aid road & bridge projects. Coming Federal projects include: countywide signing project scheduled in 2015, Bridge 44-101-110 in 2015 and Bridge 44-221-190 in 2016. Current projects include snow removal, stockpiling chips and sheeting walls in new storage building.

No drainage permits.

Auditor Sherman, Marian Oyen, Benefits Specialist, and the Commissioners discussed Care of Poor cases. One Notice of Hospitalization was received from Avera Queen of Peace Health Services. One Notice of Hospitalization was received from Avera McKennan Hospital. An Application for Medical Assistance was denied because individual has expendable income and should make payment arrangements. An Application for Assistance for an Xcel Energy bill was denied because individual has made only one payment toward bill in past year.

Motion made by Scharffenberg to convene as Board of Adjustment. Second made by Dick and motion carried.

At 10:30 a.m. a Variance Hearing was held as advertised. The request is for reduction of setback requirement for a machine shed. Tracy Hofer, P & Z Administrator, and applicant, Steve Lounsbery, were present. Hofer presented information and Lounsbery presented a sketch of the site and then explained the location of the proposed 60x120 shed. Following discussion, motion was made by Dick to approve the request for variance. Second made by Butzke and motion carried.

The Board reconvened as Board of County Commissioners.

At 10:45 a.m. a Rezone Hearing was held to rezone property from Agricultural to Commercial. The legal description: South 80 feet of County Auditor's Tracts 2 and 3, and all of County Auditor's Tracts 4 and 5 in E2SW4 27-103-53. Applicant: Ryan Roling.

Following discussion, motion was made by Dick to approve the request to rezone this property to Commercial and adopt Ordinance 2013-03 (as follows). Second was made by Scharffenberg and motion carried.

## **ORDINANCE** #2013-03

## BE IT ORDAINED BY MCCOOK COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA:

The following legally described property shall be rezoned from Agricultural to Commercial and the Official Zoning Map shall be amended to reflect such a change:

South 80 feet of County Auditor's Tracts 2 and 3, and all of County Auditor's Tracts 4 and 5 in E2SW4 27-103-53

CONFLICTS: Any prior ordinance or part of any ordinance in conflict with this ordinance is hereby repealed.

SEPARABILITY: Should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder thereby.
