June 23, 2015

The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Ralph Dybdahl. Members present: Marc Dick, Ron Scharffenberg, Steve Gordon and Sheldon Butzke.

Chairman Dybdahl led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Dybdahl called for approval of the Agenda. Motion made by Butzke to approve the Agenda. Second made by Gordon and motion carried.

The minutes from the June 9th meeting were sent to Board members for review prior to publication. Chairman Dybdahl called for approval of same. Motion made by Scharffenberg to approve the minutes for publication. Second Gordon and motion carried.

Commissioner Reports: Dybdahl attended SEFP meeting.

Mic Kreutzfeldt, Hwy Supt, presented resolution for capital outlay accumulation of Surface Transportation Program (STP) Payout Program funds; noting that States Attorney Fink has reviewed and approved as to form. These funds are federal highway funds converted to state funds and must be used for road and bridge construction, maintenance and repair. Motion made by Gordon, second Butzke, and carried, to approve and adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2015-05

CAPITAL OUTLAY ACCUMULATION

WHEREAS, SDCL 7-21-51 authorizes the accumulation of funds for capital outlay purposes, and

WHEREAS, McCook County desires highway & bridge construction to be completed on Federal-Aid highways & bridges, and

WHEREAS, the total cost for such construction work is now extraordinary in nature, exceeding the funding ability of a single-budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Surface Transportation Program Funds shall be accumulated to a maximum of \$2,000,000 over a period not exceed seven years for construction work.

Restricted for Road Purposes to Assigned for Capital Outlay Accumulations STP Funds. Second by Butzke and motion carried. The 5 Year Road & Bridge Plan was discussed. Mowing of right-of-ways was discussed. McCook County allows and encourages mowing of county road ditches before July 10th. Kreutzfeldt reported that Grant Twp is pursuing action against Andy Tieszen with regard to work done within the public rightof-way without authorization. Current projects include assisting Lake County with projects and mowing.

Motion made by Dick to convene as Drainage Commission. Second made by Scharffenberg and motion carried.

RESOLUTION 2015-06

WHEREAS, the United States relies - and will continue to rely for many years - on gasoline, diesel, and jet fuel, as well as renewable and alternative sources of energy; and

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Association of County Commissioners (SDACC) urges the United States Congress to support continued and increased development and delivery of oil from Canada to the United States; and

WHEREAS, pipelines are the safest method for the transportation of petroleum products when compared to other methods of transportation; and

WHEREAS, safety and the environment are legitimate concerns, the Keystone XL expansion project through South Dakota will meet or exceed all US pipeline safety regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Keystone XL Pipeline is critical to the creation of South Dakota jobs and to our state's economic and energy development; and

WHEREAS, TransCanada and the Keystone Pipeline currently provide over \$3.8 Million in additional property tax revenue to eleven (11) South Dakota counties annually; and

WHEREAS, the Keystone XL expansion project is expected to increase the valuation of the nine (9) South Dakota counties through which it passes by 9%; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the McCook County Board of Commissioners supports the Keystone XL expansion project and the continued and increased development and delivery of oil from North American oil reserves to American refineries through the State of South Dakota.

Effective July 1, 2015 the state reimbursement rate for mileage will increase to \$0.42 per mile for use of a privately owned vehicle; the county follows state rates.
