The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Bill Smith. Members present: Ralph Dybdahl, Marc Dick, Ron Scharffenberg, Sheldon Butzke.

Chairman Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Chairman Smith called for approval of the Agenda. Motion made by Dick to approve the Agenda. Second Scharffenberg and motion carried.

The minutes from the May 14th meeting were sent to Board members for review prior to publication. Chairman Smith called for approval of same. Motion made by Butzke to approve the minutes for publication. Second Dybdahl and motion carried.

Commission Reports: Smith noted that an updated facility is being planned for the Minnehaha County Juvenile Detention Center.

Mic Kreutzfeldt, Hwy Supt, and the Commission reviewed plans and cost estimate for new 60x80 Hwy Dept storage building. Kreutzfeldt informed the Board that a FEMA Grant was approved for the 431st Ave grade raise at Lehrman Lake area; estimated \$220,000.00. This a 75%/25% grant with the county making payment and receiving reimbursement through the FEMA Grant. This project was not budgeted for. Kreutzfeldt recommends postponing chip sealing of Valley Rd until 2014, which was budgeted at \$120,000 and use this budget to cover the building shortfall and the flood repair expenses. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed. Motion made by Dybdahl to set 9:00 a.m., Monday, July 8th, as time for bid letting for Hwy Dept storage building. Second made by Butzke and motion carried. Motion made by Scharffenberg to authorize Chairman Smith to sign 2 copies of the administrative agreement between

SECOG and McCook County, for the McCook County Road 25A-O Grade Elevation project. The compensation to SECOG shall be \$75.00 per hour, not to exceed the total of \$7,500.00 for the duration of the project. Second Dick and motion carried. Kreutzfeldt presented a utility permit for approval. Motion made by Dick to approve Water Utility Permit for TM Rural Water District. Scope of project: water service – bore under 445th Ave at 25926 445th Ave. Second made by Butzke and motion carried. Discussed box culvert on 262nd St west of 450th Ave destroyed by flooding and plans to replace it with culverts. The Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Projects for the county was reviewed. Auditor Sherman asked about a motion to supplement the Hwy Dept budget for the STP funds received in March. Motion made by Dybdahl to supplement the Hwy Dept budget in the amount of \$130,324.00 and increase the grant revenue line reflecting the STP funds received. Kreutzfeldt noted the breakdown as follows: \$55,000 for 25AN grade raise match and \$75,324 for 16A paving project. Second made by Scharffenberg and motion carried.

Motion made by Butzke to convene as Drainage Commission. Second made by Dick and motion carried.

Drainage Adm Kreutzfeldt presented drainage permit applications, noting that downstream landowner signatures were obtained and he has signed off on them:

Auditor Sherman, Mariann Oyen, Benefits Specialist, and the Commissioners discussed Care of Poor cases. Several files were reviewed & discussed. One Notice of Hospitalization was received from Avera McKennan Hospital.

Resort. Second made by Dybdahl and motion carried.

The April Financial Statement for the Hanson-McCook Regional Library was noted & filed.

The Commission received a copy of a memo sent to Board of Minerals and Environment from Dept of Environment and Natural Resources regarding Santee Sioux Nation of Nebraska's request to EPA for State status. If EPA approves this request, DENR will be required to treat them as any other adjacent state. Counties in SD within the 50 mile radius around the exterior boundaries of the reservation were notified.

A thank you for the visit, April 23rd, was received from Linda Robison, Staff Assistant for Senator Tim Johnson.

Dwayne McIntyre, Custodian, and the Commission discussed mowing of tax deed properties; 2 parcels in Salem City. Legal descriptions: Lot 10 Blk 75 Pettigrew's Second Addn and Lots 1, 2, 3 & 4 Blk 41 Pettigrew's Second Addn.

States Attorney, Mike Fink, joined the meeting. Discussion was held regarding the Salem Housing & Redevelopment Commission and issues with the building that houses our Food Pantry; leaking roof.
