April 8, 2025

The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Chuck Mehlbrech. Members present: Steve Gordon, Tom Heumiller, Marc Dick, and Charles Liesinger.

Chairman Mehlbrech led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mehlbrech called for approval of the agenda. Auditor Sherman noted the addition of an Executive Session at 9:30 a.m. for discussion re pending litigation, SDCL 1-25-2 (3). Motion Dick to approve the agenda with addition noted. Second Gordon. Motion carried.

The minutes from the March 25<sup>th</sup> meeting were sent to Board members for review prior to publication. Motion Dick to approve these minutes for publication. Second Gordon. Motion carried.

Public input: Roger Hofer provided public comment.

Commissioner Reports: Heumiller attended South Eastern Council of Governments meeting in SF.

Conflict of Interest: none noted.

Travis Raap, Hwy Supt, met with the Commission. John Wartenbee, VP Northern Truck Equipment, was present to discuss the county's need for a truck box. Wartenbee explained that he has a build slot in September 2026, and he can promise a truck box so the county can proceed with an equipment order. Raap did reach out to J-Craft after the March 25<sup>th</sup> meeting asking for cost information for a truck box but has heard nothing from this vendor. Raap noted that the pricing for a Crysteel 16' Stainless Steel dump body, plow, V-box sander, and Monroe 8' wing per Monroe Sourcewell Contract #062222 is \$214,640.00. Northern Truck Equipment is on the Sourcewell Contract. Following more discussion, Wartenbee guaranteed delivery of a truck box by the end of 2026. Motion Heumiller to purchase a truck box from Northern Truck Equipment and authorize Chairman Mehlbrech to sign a Sales Order for same. Second Dick. Motion carried.

Hwy Supt Raap presented a utility certificate and right-of-way certificate for the construction of Project Number BRO-B 8044(15), PCN 09A2, Bridge #44-091-040 to the Board for signature. Motion Liesinger to authorize Chairman Mehlbrech to sign the Utilities Certificate for this project (no utilities at this location). Second Dick. Motion carried. Motion Liesinger to authorize Chairman Mehlbrech to sign the Right-Of-Way Certificate for this project (no easement required for this project). Second Gordon. Motion carried. First Rate Excavate and SDDOT will be meeting tomorrow to discuss a haul road agreement for 02AB. Raap provided information regarding 20-year life cycle of 245 St, road going to Sun Prairie Baptist Church. Raap informed the Board that he'd like them to consider a request to hire summer/seasonal help as the Hwy Dept is still short an employee. A CDL would not be required. Request approved.

Motion Gordon to enter Executive Session at 9:30 a.m. to discuss pending litigation, SDCL 1-25-2 (3). Travis Raap, Hwy Supt, and Auditor Sherman were present. Second Dick. Motion carried. Chairman Mehlbrech declared out of Executive Session at 9:40 a.m.

Auditor Sherman informed the Board that a CD at Security State Bank, Montrose, will mature on 4/19/2025 and she'll present

interest rate options to them at their 4/22 meeting.

Michelle Stubkjaer, HR Consultant, met with the Board to provide information regarding HB1218, adding new sections to

SDCL Chapter 7-18. A board of county commissioners may not, by any method or means, prohibit or restrict an individual who is a

county employee, officer, or volunteer, from lawfully possessing any concealed firearm and compatible ammunition, while the

individual is within any county building, facility, or vehicle, or while on any real property, owned or leased by the county. A policy for

the employee handbook is being worked on.

Carol Lauer, Treasurer, met with the Commission to provide them with an office update regarding the implementation of

changes made by the SD Motor Vehicle Division.

Motion Liesinger to convene as Planning Commission. Second Heumiller. Motion carried.

Anna Flogstad, Dir of Equalization/Zoning Administrator, presented a plat for approval. Following review of the plat review

form, motion Liesinger to approve the plat. Second Gordon. Motion carried.

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Planning Commission of McCook County, South Dakota, that the plat showing Tract 1 of Hofer Addition in the Southeast Quarter of Section 27, Township 101 North, Range 55 West of the 5<sup>TH</sup> Principal Meridian, McCook County, South Dakota, having been examined, is approved in accordance with the provisions of SDCL of 1967, Chapter 11-6, and any amendments thereof.

Auditor Sherman presented an email from Julie Dykstra, SE Region Nursing Manager, regarding the nurse's office, to the Board. Questions. 1. Would the small room off the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor break room be available for the nurse's office, this would allow for an internet connection for the State Network, and a specific space each time they need to meet with a client. Would the county pay \$5000 for the office furniture in the existing nurse's office? Can the refrigerator be moved somewhere temporarily? Anna Flogstad, Dir of Equalization, and Angie McCormick, Dir of Equalization Clerk, were present. Auditor Sherman will check into a more permanent office space. Motion Heumiller to offer payment of \$3500 for the office furniture. Second Liesinger. Motion carried. Auditor Sherman will contact the Dept of Health and report back to the Board at the April 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting.

Motion Liesinger to appraise the property at \$1.00, based upon the fact that the piece is much less than one acre, and is basically isolated inside of other property owned by Mrs. Streff, and is of no real value to any other person. Second Gordon. Motion carried. Motion Dick to have St Atty Fink prepare a County Deed for said property deeding it to Gayle P Streff. Second Liesinger. Motion carried.

Auditor Sherman presented a list of lien payments received in February and March to the Board.

Webster presented an invitation for the 2025 Annual Investor Reception to the Commission, to be held on April 23<sup>rd</sup>, at Twisted Pines Venue, Parker.
